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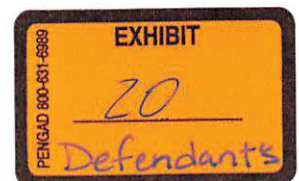

> Please find attached the draft of my rebuttal letter.
>

> Now, let me clarify some points.
>

> While we are still waiting to know if we have the original capture of that western or not (in which case, I am sorry but I will have to point the finger against who cheated, meaning Dimitrios since I do NOT intend to risk my own career on somebody else's misconduct), regarding the allegations of plagiarism we can follow two possible streets:
>

> 1. Accept the corrections they suggested, which essentially implies just adding a couple of brackets and citations and so be it; 2. > As an alternative (I don't know which kind of relationship you have with Inder), you might suggest to accept the Corrections that PNAS proposed (so that we show that we are collaborative, since we are still waiting what will happen with those images after all) and in a less solemn and more friendly way bring to his attention the fact that you know he is NOT as "immaculate" as he wants to appear either (if we adopt the criteria of plagiarism brought up by his anonymous reader).
>

> In any case, please let me know which strategy you decided to adopt.
>

> Of course I'm always available if you want to talk about this issue.
